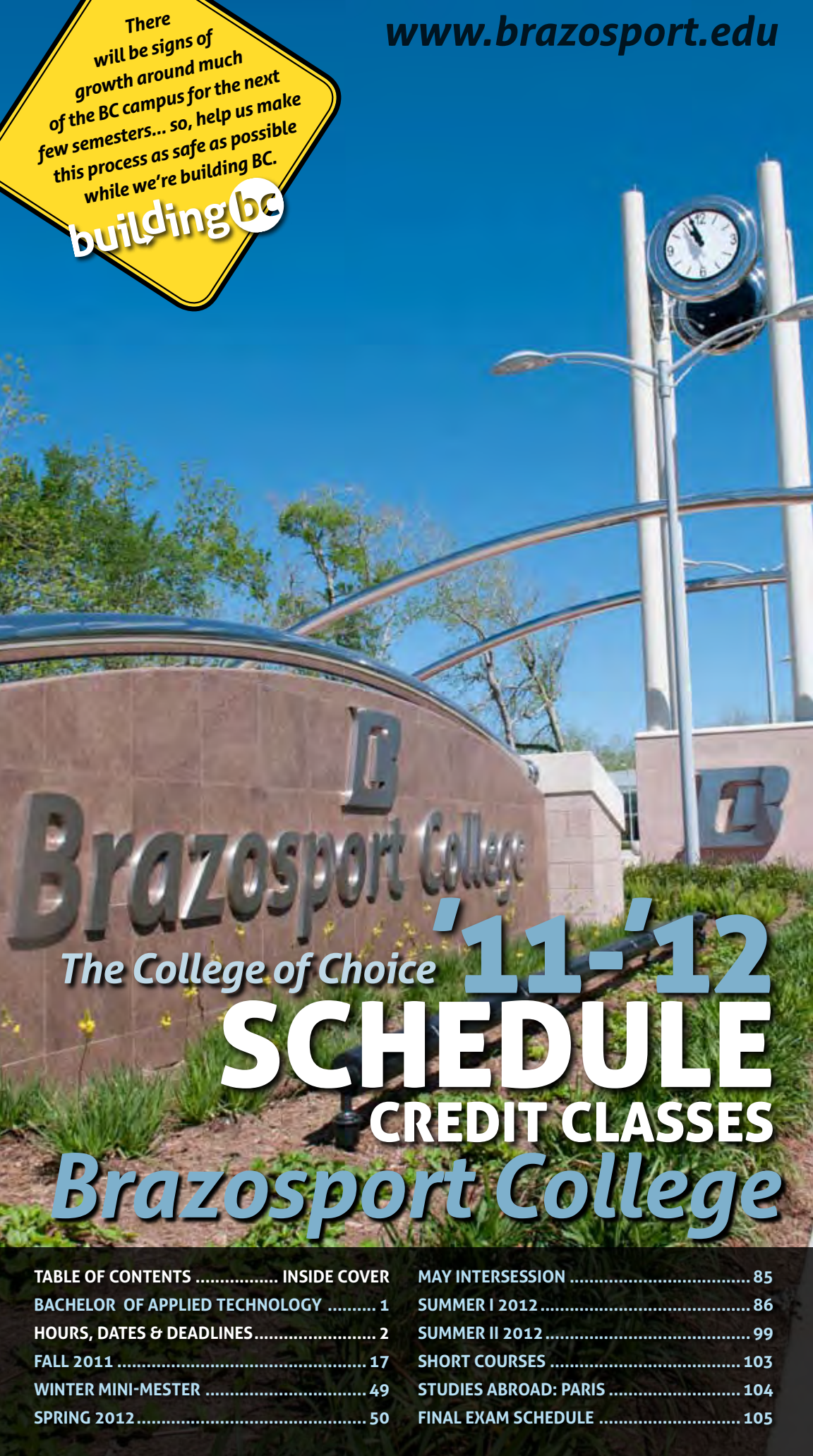

What is the Industrial Management Baccalaureate?

This program will provide management skills to those workers proficient in technology, enabling them to advance into supervisory positions. Graduates will learn to lead and manage using a wide variety of business, finance, technology, and people management skills.

This Bachelors of Applied Technology (B.A.T.) program will prepare students to:

- Apply effective oral and written communication skills in the professional work setting.
- Manage a business unit or project in compliance with state and federal law, as well as within acceptable ethical and socially responsible boundaries and recognizing differences in international business environments.
- Apply a sound understanding of leadership strategies, human behavior, behavioral interdependencies, and the influences of diversity, along with collaborative problem solving skills, to create high-performing work teams, foster a positive organizational climate and lead their workforce to success.
- Employ statistical, production, and information technology tools, as well as critical and systems thinking, to enhance decision-making and problem-solving in all aspects of the business.
- Use project, quality, risk, and technological resource management strategies to successfully implement projects, contracts, process improvement activities, and technology innovation.
- Develop and manage effective industrial and environmental safety programs.
- Provide sound assessment practices, comprehensive and prudent fiscal management, and technological vision and guidance for the evaluation and improvement of the enterprise, project, business unit, or function.

Admission Requirements:

Students must be within one semester (or 18 credits) of completing lower-division courses to meet minimum B.A.T. application requirements. Prior college-level coursework requires a minimum grade of "C" on College Algebra, Composition and Rhetoric, and all core and technical courses including internship.

Visit the BC website at www.brazosport.edu for further information related to program admission and degree completion requirements.

Enrollment in upper-division courses in Industrial Management requires separate application for admission and approval by the Bachelor of Applied Technology Admissions Committee. Admission to the Bachelor of Applied Technology program is competitive, based on GPA, completion of the lower division coursework, work history, and the ACT Collegiate Assessment of Academic Proficiency (CAAP), which measures writing, critical thinking, and mathematics skills.

Applications are accepted year round and students may start coursework in any semester.

Admissions & myBC

Deadline for Admission/Readmission Items

Students should submit applications for admission, applicable TSI scores, and have up-to-date official transcripts mailed to the office of admissions. See semester Dates and Deadlines.

myBC available 24/7

myBC is a student information system where you can:

- View your current class schedules and availability, current grades, unofficial transcript, financial aid status,
- Review your account status and pay your tuition and fees with a credit card or checking account.
- Run your own degree audit, and
- Change your PIN.
- Enroll in courses.



You must have your Student ID (social security number or assigned college number) and PIN number handy to access myBC.

If you don't know your 6-digit PIN number, you must present a photo ID at the Registrar's office to obtain it or forgot your PIN? - log into myBC and click the link "Forgot your PIN?". Enter your Student ID and your PIN will be sent to your email address on record.

To be eligible for on-line registration, you must first:

- be cleared at the Admissions office
- be eligible to self-advise or obtain enrollment clearance from the counseling office, AND
- have no holds on your record.

How to Enroll: Enrollment Policies and Procedures

Registration

Registration in courses at Brazosport College has been made simple with the addition of the myBC system. Students are offered secure access to their student records via myBC. myBC is more than just an on-line registration system. It is an information system students can use to check course availability, look up class schedules, view current grades, view unofficial transcripts, verify demographic information, view financial aid status, review tuition and fee accounts, and pay by credit card or checking account using our secure payment system (FACTS tuition manage-

ment system.) Specific information regarding access to the myBC system is available in the schedule of classes. If you require assistance completing your enrollment online, Brazosport College staff are available from 8:00AM to 6:30PM, Monday through Thursday, and 8:00AM to 11:30AM on Fridays to help you at the computer terminals located in the main lobby of the college (See page 2 for summer/holiday hours.) myBC is user friendly and allows students to register from any location that has internet access. In order to access the myBC system, you will need your student ID number (or social security number) and your PIN code.

Online Priority Registration

Students using online registration have the opportunity to enroll early using Online Priority Registration. During priority registration you may only enroll using the myBC system as on campus registration will not be available. In order to enroll early students should make sure all prerequisites to enrollment are completed including:

- Student must be fully admitted to Brazosport College prior to Online Priority Registration.
- Students who are not self-advised must meet with their counselor and obtain enrollment clearance before Online Priority

Registration begins.

- Student must not have holds for transcripts or other information with the Registrar's Office.
- Student must not owe an outstanding balance to any Brazosport College department.

Please know that admissions office staff will not have access to enroll any students during Online Priority Registration and assistance with online registration will be limited. See college calendar for dates and times.

Admissions and Registration Information: New Students

1. Obtain admissions information by going to the Admissions Office or by calling 230-3020. High school students may contact the BC Admissions Office or their high school counselor for information concerning admissions for BC concurrent enrollment and/or dual credit.
2. Complete admissions requirements. Requirements include:
 - Application for admission.
 - COMPASS scores.
 - Official high school transcript or GED scores and/or all official college transcripts.
 - Students who do not have any of these records and are 18 years of age or older, should contact the Admissions Office for individual consideration.You may come by the Admissions Office or
- call 230-3020 to see if your records are complete.
3. Select courses with your counselor or advisor unless you are self-advising. Students with a bachelor's degree or higher may self-advise and do not need to see a counselor/advisor, but must obtain clearance from the Admissions Office.
4. Register on-line using myBC. If you require assistance, college staff are available to assist you with online enrollment at the computer stations located at the main entrance of the College. Students are encouraged to register early as classes fill quickly.
5. First time college students must register for Psyc 1300 "Learning Frameworks" during their first semester.

Credit Students Enrolled Within Last Year

1. Students who were enrolled in the past year, who are eligible to self-advise, and have no holds on their record may register on-line without clearance from the Admissions Office.
2. Students who were enrolled during the past year, and have met their COMPASS requirements, but are not eligible to self-advise based on requirements for self advisement on page 14, and have been cleared for admission and advisement, must still be advised by a counselor or advisor and may then register on-line, on-site or at late registration.
3. All students registering at late registration are required to be cleared by the Admissions Office. Late Registration fees apply.
NOTE: Notify the Registrar's Office in writing of any address change before using the myBC registration system.

All Other Former Credit Students

1. Obtain admissions clearance form at the Admissions Office.
2. Submit required readmission items, Compass scores if required, an application for readmission and all up-to-date official college transcripts* by deadlines for registration. You may come by or call 230-3020 to see if your records are complete. Request that all transcripts from colleges attended since Brazosport College or from colleges concurrently enrolled in be sent to the Admissions Office.
3. Obtain admissions clearance and see your advisor/counselor — unless you are eligible to self-advise.
* *Transcripts are to be mailed to BC directly from the sending institution. Students with a bachelor's degree or higher may submit only one official transcript showing the highest degree.*

Unassigned Classes

Some classes in the schedule are listed as unassigned. Teaching assignments for these classes will be made at the end of registration.

Late Registration & Drop

A late registration fee of \$25 will apply for all students who register after the regular registration period has ended and a schedule change fee will apply for all student-initiated drop/adds processed during the published drop/add period.

Drop/Add fee of \$10 is charged for each drop/add form submitted. Exceptions are made only for canceled classes resulting in schedule changes.

BC New Student Orientation

All students with no previous college credit are required to watch an online orientation video in addition to attending Gator Boot Camp. Exemptions include transfer, continuing education, short course, ABC, and nursing students. Go to the Brazosport College web site and click on the online student orientation link to watch the video and complete a brief survey.

Virtual College of Texas

In addition to the distance learning courses taught online by Brazosport College faculty, the college also enables students to take certain courses for Brazosport College credit that are offered online by other Texas community colleges through the Virtual College of Texas (VCT). This increases scheduling flexibility for students and allows a broader diversity of course offerings. VCT course content and faculty credentials are reviewed by Brazosport College's academic administration and selected based on the quality of the curriculum and faculty resources offered. Payment Options*

1. myBC (Internet) Payment

Payments using your Credit Card or Checking account will be processed using the myBC payment system. Refer to page 11 for our internet registration payment option. Your credit card/bank account can be charged during your online session. An e-mail receipt will be issued for students indicating their e-mail address. We accept MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover. myBC is available 24 hours per day and will close as stated above.

2. Express Pay

This option is only available to students who have already registered for their classes. Students may receive a printout of their bill at the Express Pay station during the following hours:

Fees

Calculating Tuition and Fees

To calculate your tuition and fees for the credit courses you are taking, you should refer to the SCHEDULE OF ACADEMIC AND TECHNICAL CLASSES. First determine how many CREDIT HOURS (CR HR) are assigned for each course and whether a lab fee is charged. Add your credit hours for each course to get a total number of credit hours. Then, using the information from the BC tuition web page, find your total credit hours and move to the correct RESIDENT status column. IN-DISTRICT residency is defined as “within” the Brazosport Independent School District (BISD); OUT-OF-DISTRICT is outside of BISD; OUT-OF STATE or INTERNATIONAL should be determined by the Registrar’s Office. If you are not sure of your residence status, you may contact the Registrar’s Office. The dollar amount in this column should include all base tuition and fee cost; it does not include the individual LAB FEE cost associated with your course. You should add all of your LAB FEE costs to this base amount to determine the total tuition and fees owed. Students enrolling during Late Registration will be charged a \$25 Late Registration Fee. Students initiating schedule changes during Add/Drop will be charged a \$10 Schedule Change Fee per form.

Laboratory Fees

Laboratory courses require fees for supplies and expendables used by students in the courses. Laboratory fees are noted in the class schedule.

Books

NOTE TO STUDENTS TAKING JUNIOR AND SENIOR LEVEL COURSES.

3000 and 4000 level courses taken by students enrolled in the Bachelor of Applied Technology Program will have an additional course fee of \$60 per credit hour added to the above table amounts to offset the increased costs of delivering upper division courses.

Additional fees will be charged for lab fees, late registration, and schedule changes initiated by students after classes begin.

*In-District Amounts include tuition (\$50 per hour or \$25 minimum), building fee (\$9 per hour), technology fee (\$5 per hour) and student service fee (\$15 for 1 to 11 hours or \$21 for 12 or more hours).

**Out-of District Amounts include Tuition (\$79 per hour), building fee (\$9 per hour), technology fee (\$5 per hour) and student service fee (\$15 for 1 to 11 hours or \$21 for 12 or more hours).

***Out-of State/Int'l Amounts include Tuition (\$126 per hour or \$200 minimum), building fee (\$9 per hour), technology fee (\$5 per hour) and student service fee (\$15 for 1 to 11 hours or \$21 for 12 or more hours).

Refunds

Refund Dates And Rates

Students who officially withdraw from credit courses may receive refunds based on the date of withdrawal.

1. Refunds can be at 100%, 70%, 25%, or 0% - depending on date of withdrawal.

2011 – 2012 – Refunds

There are two methods for determining your refund:

1. Students who officially withdraw from the college credit program will receive refunds for all tuition and mandatory fees based on the percentages reflecting the date of withdrawal.

2. Students who officially drop a courses(s), but remain enrolled at the college, will be refunded based on the below percentages. Chart reflects the date of dropped course. Canceled courses will still be refunded at 100%.

Canceled courses will be refunded at 100%.

Additional Refund Information

- No refunds will be made for courses dropped after the above deadlines.
- Non-semester-length courses will be prorated according to state guidelines.
- Students who have an E-FACTS (NELNET) payment plan contract and have a cancelled/dropped class or have received Financial Aid should go to the CASHIER's Office to have a copy of their student bill printed and request to have their E-FACTS contract adjusted.
- Tuition and fees paid directly to Brazosport College by a sponsor, donor, or scholarship, shall be refunded to the source rather than the student.

Students may receive a cash or credit card refund at the Enrollment Specialists Counter during the following:

To receive your refund on-campus:

**Students who paid for tuition and fees by check on campus or by "myBC" online, should wait 10 business days to allow their check to clear normal banking channels before coming to the enrollment specialists counter for a refund.*

About the Facts Tuition Payment Plan

- To help you meet your educational expenses, Brazosport College is pleased to offer FACTS (NELNET) as a convenient budget plan. It is not a loan; therefore you have no debt, there are no interest or finance charges assessed and there is no credit check.
- The cost to budget monthly payments is a separate \$25 per semester nonrefundable FACTS Enrollment Fee charged by NELNET. The FACTS Enrollment Fee is automatically deducted from your account.
- The tuition payment is automatically deducted on the 20th of each month from a checking or savings account. You may also have your payment charged to your credit card. Please note: Check, Debit, and ATM Cards may be returned unpaid due to daily limits restrictions imposed by your bank.
- If your payment on the 20th is not successful, it will be reattempted on the 5th of the following month. Any time a payment is missed, you will receive notification from FACTS on how the missed payment will be handled. Your FACTS agreement will be processed until the balance owed is paid in full.
- For each missed payment, FACTS assesses a \$30 FACTS Missed Payment Fee. FACTS Missed Payment Fees are automatically deducted from the account you have provided. If your FACTS Missed Payment Fee is missed, it will be reattempted. FACTS Missed Payment Fees are payable to NELNET.
- FACTS Enrollment Fees and Missed Payment Fees are subject to change in future academic years or semesters, unless otherwise agreed by NELNET and Brazosport College. Interest earned on all custodial funds held by FACTS is payable to NELNET.
- To enroll in the FACTS payment plan you will need to complete a FACTS Automatic Tuition Payment Agreement through your myBC account. There is no fee to make a full payment on your tuition and fees during each semester.

Completing the Facts Agreement

When you enroll with FACTS be sure to have the following information:

- Student ID number as assigned by Brazosport College.
 - The name and address of the person responsible for making the payments.
 - Account Information for the responsible person.
1. If paying by automatic bank payments you will need:
 - the financial institution's name,
 - telephone number, account number
 - the financial institution's routing number.

Most of this information is located on your check.

2. If paying by credit card, you will need the credit card number and expiration date.
- You will be asked to create a FACTS Access Code. The FACTS Access Code is designed to help protect private information regarding your agreement.

FACTS Payment plan deadlines for Early and Late Registration can be found listed by semester in the Dates and Deadline section.

Commonly Asked Questions About FACTS

1. When and what time will the funds be withdrawn from my bank account?

FACTS specifies the date each payment will occur but it is your financial institution that determines the time of day the payment is debited. FACTS recommends you check with your financial institution to determine how far in advance funds should be deposited into your account to ensure the automatic payment clears. If a payment date falls on a weekend or holiday, the payment will be attempted the following business day.

2. How will I be notified of my payment?

Once your agreement is posted to the FACTS system, you will receive a confirmation notification of your payment amount by e-mail or letter. Payments will be processed until the total balance is paid in full. The notification has important information you must have to log on to My FACTS Account. The notification also serves as a reminder that a \$25.00 per semester nonrefundable FACTS Enrollment Fee will be processed from the account indicated on the agreement.

3. Can I pay by phone with FACTS?

In accordance with the Terms & Conditions of your FACTS agreement, payments are processed electronically. FACTS does not accept payments by phone.

4. What is the FACTS Access Code?

To help protect your privacy, FACTS asks the person responsible for the payments to create an access code. If you should call into FACTS inquiring about your FACTS agreement

or inquire online through My FACTS Account, you will be required to verify your FACTS Access Code. If you do not create an access code on your FACTS agreement, one will be randomly assigned to you. Your FACTS Access Code will be identified on your FACTS Confirmation Letter. Please remember to keep a copy of your confirmation letter.

Enrolling online is simple, secure, and easy. Connect to the FACTS Web site through the myBC link at www.brazosport.edu on BC Website screen click on "REGISTRATION SYSTEM" enter student ID & PIN, click on "green arrow" from Student Information drop down box, click on "Review/Pay Acct." review the student bill click on "Pay by Nelnet/Credit Card", click on "Continue Payment", click on box for "arrange payments". The payment plan can accommodate down payments and monthly payments. Once you are in e-FACTS, refer to the menu bar at the top for additional answers to questions you may have. Use the "Proceed" button to move through the steps, making sure you read all the information provided. Before you click the submit button, please carefully read through the Final Review and the Terms and Conditions. An immediate e-mail will be sent (if an e-mail address was provided for the person responsible for payment) confirming enrollment through FACTS.

Call FACTS (NELNET) at (800) 609-8056 to make any changes to your address, phone, or banking information. If you have questions regarding your FACTS agreement please contact FACTS directly or go to My FACTS Account to review your agreement online. Please remember to access My FACTS Account, the instructions are located in your Confirmation Letter or e-mail. If you have questions regarding your financial aid award, please call Brazosport College's Financial Aid Office at (979) 230-3377.

Students who have an E-FACTS contract and have a cancelled/dropped class or have received Financial Aid should go to the CASHIER'S OFFICE to have a copy of their student bill printed and request to have their E-FACTS contract adjusted.

Financial Aid

How to Apply for Financial Aid

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.FAFSA.e.gov
- After receiving your SAR (Student Aid Report) from the Department of Education, the Brazosport College Financial Aid Office will notify the student on their myBC account what forms are needed. These forms are available on line at www.brazosport.edu/financialaid. You may need to submit your 1040/1040A/1040EZ tax forms or other requested verification documents.
- To assure financial aid is awarded prior to the payment deadline a complete financial aid file must be in the Financial Aid office by the following dates
 - Fall Semester- June 1
 - Spring Semester – November 1
 - Summer Semester – April 1You must make arrangements to pay your bill if Financial Aid is not awarded by payment deadline.
- You will be able to check your financial aid status on the online registration system myBC by visiting www.brazosport.edu. Award letters are mailed to each student at the mailing address on file.
- A number of scholarships are available to current and prospective students of Brazosport College. Applications are available at the financial aid office and online at www.brazosport.edu/financialaid. These applications must be returned with a letter of recommendation.
- The Federal Direct Subsidized/unsubsidized loan requires an additional application that is available at the Financial Aid office upon your request.

Financial Aid

The following types of financial aid are available to students:

GRANTS are aid funds that do not have to be paid back by a student who qualifies and completes his/her courses. Eligibility is determined based on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application.

- Grants available based upon federal and state funding are: Pell Grant, Texas Public Education Grant, TEXAS Grant, Texas Educational Opportunity Grant, Federal Student Educational Opportunity Grant, LEAP, SLEAP.

SCHOLARSHIPS are aid funds given by donors to assist students. To qualify for a scholarship, students typically must be enrolled full-time and maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average. A limited number of scholarships for part-time students are available. Contact the Financial Aid Office to obtain information on available scholarships, eligibility requirements, and application forms.

WORK STUDY is a program in which students may work up to 20 hours per week both on and off campus. Jobs such as typists, lab assistants, library aides, and office aides are available. Applications are available in the Career Center and online at www.brazosport.edu/financialaid.

DIRECT LOAN LOAN PROGRAM Brazosport College participates in the subsidized/unsubsidized DIRECT Loan Program. The college does NOT participate in the Parent (PLUS) Loan Program. Applications available upon request in the financial aid office.

HAZLEWOOD ACT is for students who served honorably in the U.S. armed forces may have their tuition and fees (except college service fees) waived if they meet specific conditions. All documentation must be filed with the Financial Aid Office prior to payment deadline.

HAZLEWOOD LEGACY ACT extends eligibility to spouses, and permit eligible veterans to assign their unused hours to their child. Eligible dependents and spouses may have their tuition and fees (except college service fees) waived if they meet specific conditions. All documentation must be filed with the Financial Aid Office prior to the payment deadline.

BOOKSTORE CHARGES Students with funds available, may charge any allowable bookstore expense to their student account. Check the Financial Aid website for exact charging periods.

REFUNDS are available to students with balances in their financial aid account. Funds will be direct deposited onto the student's myBC student debit card. Please check the financial aid website for exact dates.

Texas Success Initiative

Texas Success Initiative

Each undergraduate student, unless exempt, who enters Brazosport College must be tested for reading, writing, and mathematics skills with a coordinating board-approved assessment prior to enrolling in college-level coursework. Brazosport College administers the Compass tests to assess students. A student who has not been tested may enroll in coursework only under the special circumstances provided below.

TSI Exemptions/waivers

- performing at levels that the THECB defines for an exemption on the SAT, the ACT, or the exit-level TAKS/TAAS and enrolling within the time limits defined in the THECB rule.
- not seeking a degree or certificate (casual student) as determined by the chief academic officer.
- transferring from an accredited institution of higher education and who has earned a grade of "C" or better on appropriate college-level coursework as determined by Brazosport College.
- enrolling in a Level-One certificate program (42 or fewer semester credit hours). Exemptions for certificate students allow the students to take no more than 6 SCH outside the certificate program curriculum. Students who want to take more than 6 SCH outside the program must be assessed prior to enrolling.
- having previously attended an accredited Texas public institution of higher education and having been determined by that institution to have met TSI college-level readiness standards.
- having graduated with an associate or a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution.
- serving on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States, the Texas National Guard, or as a member of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States and has been serving for at least three years preceding enrollment.
- who on or after August 1, 1990, was honorably discharged, retired, or released from active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States or the Texas National Guard or as a member of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States.

A student must document eligibility for applicable exceptions by providing the Registrar's Office with official transcripts or other official documents. Note that certain courses require placement testing before they can be taken, regardless of exemptions/exceptions.

The TSI requirements will be waived for students who are enrolled in an approved certificate program at Brazosport College. You are responsible for informing counselors and faculty advisors of your enrollment in a certificate program.

Mandatory Remediation

If your TSI test scores indicate you need remediation, you must enroll and remain enrolled in transitional courses until you can demonstrate appropriate skills. You may not withdraw from these courses without permission from the dean unless you withdraw from the college.

Academic Advisement

Students who must see counselors are encouraged to drop by the counseling center. See page 2 for counseling office hours.

It will be important for each student to have as much of the admissions information completed as possible before you see a counselor or faculty advisor; however, a student may see a counselor at any time during the schedule noted above.

During late registration, counselors and faculty advisors will be available to students in the counseling center from 8 a.m. to *6:30 p.m. each day *(8:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m. Mon, 8:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m. T-Th, Summer I & Summer II).

Students who are eligible to self-advise are reminded that they are not required to see a counselor, even though they may choose to do so.

Self Advisement

Students may qualify for self-advisement if:

- you have a bachelor's degree or:
- are a former or continuing student and you are exempt from or have satisfied all sections of the Texas Success Initiative.
- are not on academic probation or suspension at Brazosport College or any other college.

Please note: Students who self-advise must meet all prerequisite requirements for courses to be taken including private music, piano and all cooperative education courses.

Testing Requirements

If you are exempt from taking a TSI test based on any of the exemptions listed in the Brazosport College Development Plan and paraphrased on page 13, you:

- do not have to take the (COMPASS) test.
- must meet college testing prerequisites before you can enroll in courses with skills prerequisites.
- do not have to take remedial courses each semester.

If you are enrolled in an occupational-technical certificate program of 42 hours or less, you:

- are required to be assessed by taking the placement test when you enroll in courses that require skill prerequisites.
- are not required to take a TSI test as long as you remain enrolled in a TSI – waived certificate program and do not take general education courses outside of this program.

All other students must . . .

- meet college test score prerequisites for courses that require them.
- take a TSI test by
Aug. 30, 2011 (F 2011)
Jan. 18, 2012 (Sp 2012)
June 2, 2012 (SSI 2012)
July 12, 2012 (SSII 2012) in order to enroll in college-level courses.
- be enrolled continuously in a remedial course each semester if you have not satisfied any part of the Texas Success Initiative testing. You will be permitted to withdraw from these courses upon withdrawal from all college courses. You will not earn college credit for remedial classes.

Calculators for Compass

Non-graphing calculators are provided as part of the COMPASS test.

Procedures for TSI Testing

- Register for a test date and time.
- Supply your social security number.
- Report to the testing room 15 minutes before test time. Allow 4-5 hours to complete the test. You must present photo identification at the time of your test.

Miscellaneous

College Concurrent Enrollment

If you are registered simultaneously at more than one public college, see the Brazosport College Registrar and Cashier's Office for more information about registration and the computation of tuition and fees.

Concurrent enrollment also requires approval from the Dean, Educational Programs and Services.

Proof Of Residency

All students must complete a residency questionnaire and sign an oath of Texas residency. Proof of residency may be required. Documents proving that you have established Texas as your permanent domicile may be required, as well as proof that you have maintained a residence in Texas for at least 12 consecutive months prior to the date of enrollment. See the registrar's office for additional information.

Non-citizens must present their permanent residence card or appropriate visa at registration. Additional documentation may be required for permanent residents who want to qualify for Texas residency.

*Changes to a student's residence classification may proceed only after a review of written request accompanied by adequate proof of domicile.

Payment Method

Brazosport College accepts payment by cash, check, Mastercard, Visa, American Express and Discover. Any returned check or charge will be assessed an additional \$25 fee and turned over to a collection agency.
